MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2015 – 600

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRUST FUND FOR ALL PHILHEALTH PAYMENTS FOR TSeKaP (PCBI), TB-DOTS, MCP AND NCP TO GOVERNMENT-OWNED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND REFELECTING THAT THE CONCERNED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS SHALL MANAGE THE TRUST FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES SET BY THE PHILIPPINE HEALTH INSURANCE CORPORATION.

WHEREAS, in support of the Aquino Health Agenda to provide Universal Health Care to all Filipinos, also known as Kalusugang Pangkalahatan (KP), and consistent with its executive plan, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation aims to ensure that all Filipinos have access to quality health services that are efficiently delivered, equitably distributed, soundly financed and appropriately utilized by an informed and empowered public;

WHEREAS, to achieve these goals, the Corporation through PhilHealth Board Resolution No. 1587,s 2012 amended the implementation of the Outpatient Benefit Package, and approved a Primary Care Benefit I (PCB I) Package, with the following objectives:

1. Expand the number of services included in the Primary Health Care benefits for PhilHealth members;
2. Increase the utilization rate for services included in the Primary Health Care benefits for PhilHealth members;
3. Enhance incentives for PCB providers to promote health behavior, prevent diseases and/or associated complications, and facilitate appropriate referral, and
4. Ensure complete and timely reports on health data for monitoring, performance assessment and evaluation purposes.

WHEREAS, for the transition period (CY 2012-2013) THE Primary Care Benefits I (PCB I) package shall be implemented to cover members under the Sponsored Program, Organized Groups and Overseas Workers Program, and their qualified dependents;

WHEREAS, the disposition and allocation of the PFTR shall be as follows:

1. **Eighty percent (80 %) of PFPR is for operational costs. For drugs and medicines (PNDP) to be dispensed at the facility including drugs and medicines for Asthma , ACE and pneumonia, and for**

reagents, medical supplies, equipment (i.e. ambulance, ambulance stretcher , etc.) informat on technology (IT) equipment exclusively for facility use to facilitate reporting and data –base- build up), capability-building-for staff, infrastructure or any other use related and necessary for the delivery of required services including referral fees for diagnostic services not available in the facility.

2. The remaining twenty percent (20 %) shall be exclusively utilized as honoraria of the staff of the PCB facility and for the improvement of their capabilities that would enable them to provide better health services.
 - a. Ten percent (10%) for the physician.
 - b. Five percent (5%) for the other health professional staff of the facility, and
 - c. Five percent (5 %) for non-health professional staff including volunteers and community members of health teams, (e.g., Women’s Health Team or Community Health Team).

WHEREAS, all TB DOTS (Tuberculosis DIRECTLY Observed Treatment Short Course Chemotherapy) facilities shall allocate reimbursement for TB DOTS Package based on their existing policies and procedures;

WHEREAS, TB DOTS facilities shall follow the following guidelines prescribed by DOH in the latest NTP Manual of Procedures;

- a) Forty percent (40%) for the facility fee.
- b) Twenty five percent (25%) for the referring physician to cover the consultation services during the course of treatment. Should there be no referring physician, this portion shall also be allotted as facility fee.
- c) Thirty five percent (35%) for the services of staff of the TB DOTS facility.

WHEREAS, this may also be used for referral fees of warranted diagnostic services the one not available in the facility and quality assurance of sputum microscopy;

WHEREAS, the fees for services of the health facility staff shall be pooled and distributed among health personnel who were involved in the delivery of health personnel who were involved in the delivery of health services for TB including the DOTS physician, nurses, midwives, medical technologists or sputum microscopist, barangay health workers and treatment partners;

WHEREAS, the Maternal Care Package (MCP) covers the essential health services during ante natal period, entire stages labor, normal delivery and immediate postpartum period including follow-up visits within the first 72 hours and 1 week after delivery;

WHEREAS, the MCP Package rate is P8,000.00 which may be availed in birthing homes/maternity clinics. The professional fee shall be 40% of the package rate while the remaining 60% is for the facility fee;

WHEREAS, out of the P8,000.00 MCP rate, P3,200.00 will be for the facility health professionals to cover of professional fees of the attending RHU staff to wit:

BEMONC (Basic Emergency Obstetric and Neonatal Care trained) Physician	P1,000.00
BEMONC trained Public Health Nurse	P 250.00
BEMONC trained Rural Health Midwife (RHM)	P 1,000.00
Non BEMONC trained RHM c/o BEMONC trained RHM	P 600.00
Medical Technologist	P 250.00
Ambulance Driver c/o designated casual	P 100.00

WHEREAS, the remaining P4,600 will be for the facility to cover the cost of medicines and supplies used for every Normal Spontaneous Delivery. The amount of P1,500.00 for the member's pre-natal care fee will be used for the pre-natal expenses of the PhilHealth member's/dependent patient such as drugs and medicines, laboratory tests and other ancillary services, and Tetanus Toxoid immunization.

WHEREAS, Pregnancy and childbirth involve both the mother and the newborn. The Newborn Care Package ensures that newborns have access to health care services within their first hour of life.

WHEREAS, this Package shall cover essential health services that newborns most receive within the first hours of life regardless of the method of their delivery and presence of co-morbidities.

WHEREAS, the amount of the package shall be P1,550.00 and paid to the facility.

The package has the following components.

Essential Newborn Care

- a. Immediate drying of the baby, early skin to skin contact timely cord clamping, non separation of mother/baby for early breastfeeding, initiation, eye prophylaxis, vitamin K administration, weighing of the newborn, first dose of hepatitis B and BCG vaccine. ----- P500.00
- b. Professional fee ----- P500.00

Newborn Screening test (for metabolic diseases) ----- P550.00

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan duly assembled that:

SECTION I- This ordinance shall be known as an **ORDINANCE CREATING A TRUST FUND FOR ALL PHILHEALTH PAYMENTS FOR TSEKAP (PCBI), TB-DOTS, MCP AND NCP TO GOVERNMENT -OWNED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND REFLECTING THAT THE CONCERNED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS SHALL MANAGE THE TRUST FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES SET BY THE PHILIPPINE HEALTH INSURANCE CORPORATION.**

SECTION II- Reparability Clause. The provisions of this ordinance shall hereby be declared separable, and in the even one or more of such provisions are held unconstitutional, the validity of other provisions shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION III. Effectivity Clause. This Municipal Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the reviewing authority and at the end of its posting at prominent places in the Municipal Hall and other three (3) conspicuous places in the municipality for three (3) consecutive weeks, whichever comes later.


